1) DEVELOP INTERNSHIP PLAN

IDENTIFY

Search online job boards and professional associations in industry of interest.

Regularly check with employers of interest and build recruiting contacts.

Check RICElink, iNet, and the "hidden job market" for opportunities.

NETWORK

Update your LinkedIn profile. Tap into your network

(i.e. faculty, family, friends, professionals, alumni, etc.) and let them know the type of opportunity you are seeking.



Tailor your resume and cover letter for each opportunity to demonstrate the value you bring.

Stay organized by tracking timelines and communications.

If possible, follow up with the hiring manager



Schedule a mock interview session to hone your interviewing skills.

Prepare questions for the interviewer(s) about the internship and the company.

Send a thank you note to the interviewer(s) and reiterate your interest in the company.

JOIN A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION

Professional associations are an easy way to learn about an industry.

Connect with faculty in your major about possible opportunities.

GRADUATE SCHOOL Meet with a career counselor to review choices and fit, or figure out what is best for you.
